- BGC is hosting a monthly Zoom call for our pastors and leaders. Next one is February 17. Please join in for one hour once a month.
- Our Global personnel are safe and healthy. Many are in lockdown and have been using Zoom and Skype to engage with their people.
- Missional alignment with our national and district leaders is progressing well. There are weekly connection calls and synergy is building. Please encourage your district coach to pursue a closer connection within the BGC family.
- Our seminary is proposing a new M.A. degree in church revitalization and church planting. Canadian Baptist Seminary is out of debt and looking ahead to how we can bless our Conference and the church in Canada. Once the degree has cleared the internal approval process, it will be offered at our campus in Langley, BC.
- Kairos is another option for pastors seeking theological education. Please contact Kevin Schular for information on the partnership with BGC and Sioux Falls Seminary
- Prayer ministry there is a weekly prayer page sent out to those requesting it. Are you receiving it? Email Josh in National office to be included. Also, a Day of Prayer and Fasting is planned for March 3. In the past, we have had a Week of Prayer to start the calendar year. This year we thought to change it up and seek engagement from all our pastors and leaders for one day of intense focus. Canada is in need of spiritual awakening!
- BGC Canada has been gifted a church building in Stettler, AB. The congregation there had dwindled to 5 people. We will close the church for now but look to replant it when COVID restrictions are more favorable to a launch.
- BGC has a ministry into Iran by satellite TV connected through The House of Omeed. We are broadcasting sermons by BGC pastors dubbed into Farsi. We are hearing good reports from those who view the broadcast.
- The national office reports that we are in stable financially. Donations from churches are down from last year but expenses are less as well. The result is a small surplus at end of 2020. Praise God and thanks so much for your continued support.




