Hello from Edmonton – I am in self-isolation until Sunday. I returned from Colombia where I was with Tearfund to see the work they are doing with refugees from Venezuela. Over two million have crossed the border into Colombia due to the massive breakdown of Venezuelan society. BGC Canada sent a donation last year to help feed and shelter the people. I was invited there to see how the work is going but I cut my trip short to dash back home before borders got worse. I have been housebound for almost two weeks now.

COVID 19 has upended our world. As of today, 53
Canadians have died from Coronavirus. I also read in MacLean's magazine that nearly two-thirds of
Canadian households have lost work or anticipate losing work as a result of the outbreak. The scale of the damage wrought by the shutdown has become inescapable. Across Canada, employers have laid off workers amid efforts to stop the spread of the virus resulting in 929,000 Canadians filing new jobless claims last week.

Let me start by affirming that our confidence is in the Lord. I have been claiming Psalm 57:1: "Have mercy on me, my God, have mercy on me, for in you I take refuge. I will take refuge in the shadow of your wings until the disaster has passed." The Apostle John closely worked with Jesus during His earthly ministry. But when John was in isolation on Patmos he saw Christ in a new way. In that moment: "When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. Then he placed his right hand on me and said: 'Do not be afraid. I am the First and the Last." Revelation 1:17. Jesus calls us to courage and faith – not to give in to fear.

But let me ask you two pastoral and leadership questions to reflect on:

1. What is occupying your thoughts? "When doubts filled my mind, your comfort gave me renewed hope and cheer." Psalm 94:19

The ministry strategy and spiritual vitality of every BGC leader will be tested in the short and long term

- Your personal piety and devotion to Christ has to be the priority – drink deeply from Scripture and commune with God in prayer for yourself and your people
- Are you modelling Christlikeness to your family and congregation?
- How are you offering pastoral care in time of loss, grief and possible bereavement
- If donations decrease, are you prepared for layoffs or reduced salary?
- How will this affect the mental health of your congregation – as well as yours?
- This health crisis is exposing our organizations we see the good, strong elements as well as learning where we need to do better work
- You might think that holding virtual services will be a brief experience but what if it is 18 months before normalcy returns? https://www.theatlantic.com/fa...
- 2. What opportunities do you see in this time of upheaval?

This is the moment to lead with missional passion. Our tendencies are to either under or overreact in crisis. But what if we are entering a fundamental reset moment – how will we do church now? Are we on the edge of something new and different? There are methods we can adapt from the global church to help us. Many of us have prayed for God to awaken the Church and nation – this could be that moment. Innovation can be an exciting way for gospel proclamation beyond your church walls.
