Hello -

I hope you are doing well as this August winds down. Did you have time to relax and regroup over the summer? I did a lot of fishing, walking and reading books on First Nations issues and the Bonhoeffer biography. Laura and I were able to fly to the US to visit our daughter and my sister. We came home with a negative Covid test and we

were thankful for some time away in another environment.

This has been an eventful summer! Western Canada has seen extreme heat, drought and thick smoke from forest fires. Tension from the discovery of unmarked graves at residential school sites and the debacle in Afghanistan have dominated the news. Inflation is raising prices in the grocery store, gas stations and other goods and services.

We continue to deal with the changing provincial health guidelines on grappling with Covid and its variants. There is growing evidence of physical, mental, and emotional toll due to Covid. (Please read the article below on the dismal effect Covid is having in Canada) As a result, have some Canadian Christians decided that physical gathering at church is not important? We will know more when September arrives but many of our BGC pastors are not sure where some of their congregation is. They are not attending online or in-person and are not responding to emails or texts. Let's pray for one another as we enter a new season of church life!

Now we find ourselves in a federal election campaign as well. Canada is a pluralistic society and Bible-believers are often offside with our culture on issues like euthanasia, prostitution, legalized cannabis, and LGBTQ. We are made to feel un-Canadian if don't have the same values as the majority hold to. If the current government is re-elected with a majority we may face similar challenges like the summer student grant issue from 2017.

Christians are historically nonconformist – going back to the book of Acts

where the apostles declared to the authorities "We ought to obey God rather than men." We can and should participate in the public square and collaborate with others for the good of our society. We are called to love our neighbors and bless our communities in Jesus' name. He "went around doing good" (Acts 10:38) whether the people believed in Him or not. There is often hostility or bewilderment to our evangelical positions – but people are still looking for truth!

This fall BGC wants to continue our monthly Zoom meetings for our pastors and leaders. Our goal is to resource you so that you can lead well in this season.
