The break during COVID has allowed many to rethink how the Canadian church can be more fruitful. This is a key moment for us in the BGC – will we step up in faith or fall back on familiar, comfortable routines that kept the saints content but didn't reach the lost in our context.

CHURCH TURN AROUND is NOT:

- Focusing on numbers, it's focusing on souls.
- About being current, it's about contextualizing the message.
- A mechanical, methodological strategy, it requires Spirit Inspired innovation and courage.
- Watering down the Gospel, it's about removing the human barriers that prevent people from coming to Christ.

- Making members, it's about making disciples who make disciples who make disciples. Church leaders must:
- Be honest with where they are at and where the church is at.
- Be willing to confront their own personal preferences for the sake of the mission.
- Be faith-filled, bet-the-farm, risk-takers.

I trust you will enter this season of ministry with faith and courage. Join us on September 23 for a discussion of how to move forward into greater fruitfulness.

Canadian Baptist Seminary



CBS is moving forward even under the stress of COVID!

Our seminary is located in Langley, BC on the campus of Trinity Western University. We were one of the founders of the ACTS consortium: Associated Canadian Theological Schools. CBS has seen the ebb and flows over the years, particularly with our finances. Two years ago we were deeply in arrears to our seminary partners and could not always pay our staff on time.

With God's help and a great response from BGC churches and individual donors, we have changed the narrative. CBS is now stable financially and we are planning for future ministry effectiveness.

BC universities have a mix of in-person and online this fall. However, this has not adversely impacted our enrollment. Many pastors and laypeople are taking courses during COVID.

Our Regents are considering a new M.A. degree that I believe will be especially valuable in this season of the Canadian church. Revitalization of the church

and church planting will be the major emphasis. Once the Regents approve it, the next step is presenting it to ACTS. This could all be completed by end of 2020.

I became President of CBS in 2018. Initially, there was a lot of stress on me as we negotiated for a new position within the ACTS consortium and tried to raise funds to pay off debt. Now that part is behind us and we are looking ahead with faith and confidence. I believe CBS can make a kingdom impact for our Conference in the immediate future.
