Hello from Edmonton -

this is Thanksgiving week and I have many reasons to bless the Lord. He has been faithful, forgiving and sustaining all through my life. I have been blessed with 41 years of marriage to Laura, 3 children and 6 grandchildren. And now to be serving the BCC for 7 years is a joy and privilege. I love our Conference - the pastors, people and the diverse locations where we have our churches. I

hope you have had a good week giving thanks as well.

What a privilege it is to be involved in encouraging and training Christian leaders! The Great Commission is well-known to most readers of this page. We are familiar with Christ's words to go to the nations with the gospel, baptize the believers in the name of the Triune God, and then teach them to obey all that Jesus has commanded.

I have been meditating on one phrase from the Great Commission: "teach them <u>TO OBEY</u> all that I commanded". Discipleship is not just an information dump on believers - it is teaching obedience to our Lord and His Word.

This year I have traveled to parts of the world where it is not easy to obey Christ. I have been teaching believers who live in Muslim, Hindu, and Buddhist nations. Many of these Christians have been shunned, beaten, hospitalized, arrested, or had their homes burned down because they shared Christ with their community. They have counted the cost of living in obedience to the Lord - and did not back away when adversity came their way. I was deeply inspired and convicted in their presence.

My conviction is that the local church is the God-ordained institution where the Great Commission begins. (BGC exists by the will and funding of our churches.) Believers are sent out from their church to serve as pastors, missionaries, and in other ministries. But very few churches can train pastors and missionaries by themselves. Denominational offices, Bible colleges, and seminaries support the local church in raising up godly, qualified leaders. Canadian Baptist Seminary has been committed to teaching obedience to Christ for over 100 years. We began in 1918 as Vancouver Bible Institute and then CBS since 1988. It is very

encouraging to see increasing enrolment from our BGC pastors, missionaries, and other lay leaders increasing in 2022.

National office and BGC Stewardship Foundation are granting generous subsidies to our people to assist them with their theological education. But always the primary objective is the Great Commission and leading our people **TO OBEY** all that Christ commanded.

Thanks so much for your prayers, encouragement, and financial support. Please continue to support National Office in this last quarter of 2022. We are partners together and your participation is valued now more than ever!

At Celebration in June we introduced the Reframe initiative on the future of the BGC. We are eager to advance Reframe to equip and support our churches for effective ministry and steadfastness in a rapidly shifting society. While we are not without hope, we are sobered by the realities of the shifts in progressive theology, church leadership and Canadian society. How will the BGC position ourselves to be faithful to scripture and minister effectively in this season?

The initial input from our pastors and leaders has been pivotal in creating this path. The input has been compiled into 3 primary areas for development: Position, Posture, and Resources. Each of these areas will be fully developed through cohorts, zoom sessions, in person gatherings and 1-to-1 conversations. My expectation is that full development will take 1-2 years.


